- We refinanced in 2013, those bonds can not be refunded before December 2023.
- Our bonds will be paid for December 2026
- Bond Counsel reviews the percentage of savings on refinancing, an average of 3-5%. Our current savings is (3%).
- Restructure the payments, a reduction in payments, however we pay for it in the end.
- 2013 total cost to refinance was \$54,249.35

- I also report the fraud to the State for each employee






